Ann Clare LeZotte is a graduate of Sarah Lawrence College and has had her poems published in the American Poetry Review, the New Republic, and the Threepenny Review.

The title refers to the Nazi plan, hatched at Tiergartenstrasse 4 in Berlin, to eliminate the disabled in the name of racial purity. While it was officially cancelled
